Does the Swiss government take the SDGs seriously?

- »Fortunately«, so the Swiss government, are the SDGs only international «soft law»
- Switzerland does not (yet) have a comprehensive strategy for achieving the SDGs
- Western countries generally hope to achieve the SDGs without changing significantly their mode of production and consumption
- What to do?
- **Democracy!**
Pressure from public opinion and civil society is imperative

SDGs: Challenges for Western countries

Three central questions:

- 1. How to reverse the worldwide ecological degradation?**
- 2. How to achieve prosperity for all human beings of this world?**
- 3. How to reduce inequality within and between countries?**

Four central problems:

- 1. Ecology – Western standards cannot be globalized**
- 2. Economy – Our mode of production and consumption is unsustainable**
- 3. Inequality – pushback of the economic and political elites**
- 4. Technology alone will not solve the problem – social and economic transformation is necessary**

In Switzerland SDGs face a political hurdle race

- Some SDGs need new laws or even constitutional amendments
- Will the necessary laws and amendments convince a majority of citizens and cantons?
- For constitutional amendments a popular vote is compulsory
- Amendments need a double majority of citizens + member states (so called «cantons»)

What citizens could use to further the SDGs

- 100'000 citizens can sign a proposal for an amendment and enforce a popular vote («initiative»)
- If Swiss parliament adopts a new law (which hinders the SDGs), 50'000 citizens can compel a popular vote about it («referendum»)

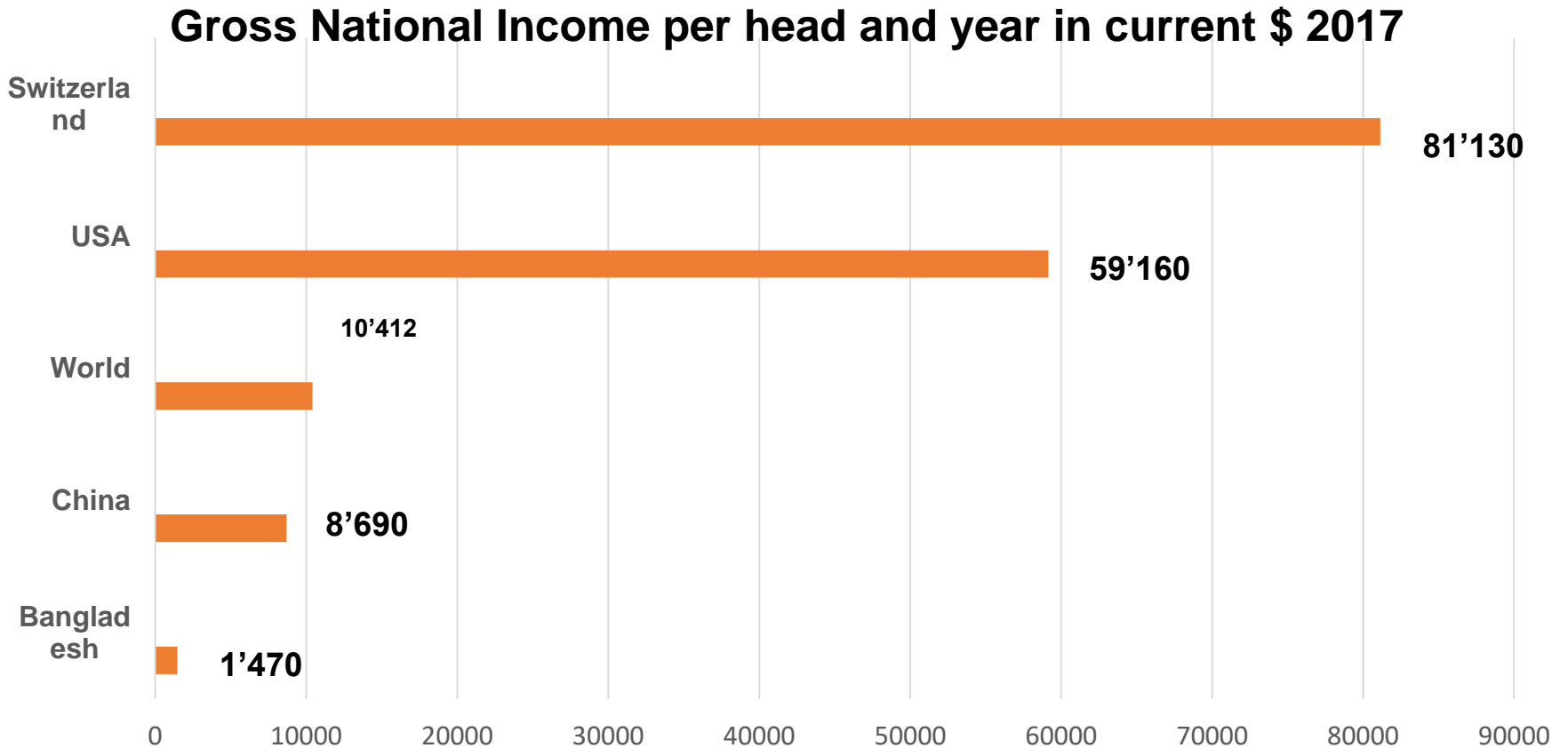
Ecological challenges

Actions required to achieve some SDGs I

SDG 7: Ensure access to affordable, reliable, sustainable and modern energy total

- **Requires in Switzerland the total decarbonization of energy production, industrial processes and transportation**

SDG 12: Ensure sustainable consumption and production patterns

- **Requires in Switzerland among other measures to put the productivity gains in reduced working hours, more public services and bigger budgets for international aid (development and climate finance)**

Actions required to achieve some SDGs

II

SDG 8: Promote inclusive and sustainable economic growth, employment and decent work for all

- Realize SDG 12 and find ways to de-growth the rich countries without provoking the collapse of the world economy

SDG 10: Reduce inequality [within and] among countries

- Reform the WTO (more “policy space” for poor countries) and Re-regulate cross-border capital transactions

SDG 17: Revitalize the global partnership for sustainable development

- Deliver finally the promised climate and development finance

Plenty of resistances to expect

- In democracies, a majority of citizens has to agree to the necessary policies
- Even if we divide the measures into single steps and decide on them one after the other, we will face a sceptical population, powerful foes, and difficult referendums
- Would a technocratic government without “democratic shackles” decide the necessary policies more quickly and easily? And could it impose them by decree?
- **Take a look at China and its environmental policies**
